The Tompkins County Youth Services Department invests time, resources and funding in communities to enable all youth to thrive in school, work and life. Our youth are provided opportunities that allow them to thrive from childhood to adulthood. Here are some community resources for youth and their parents funded by the TCYSD.

Ithaca Youth Bureau - Big Brothers Big Sisters, Outing, Recreation Support Services, and Youth Employment Service

Big Brothers Big Sisters provides participants with mentors who emphasize friendship, are patient, consistent and dependable. If you're an adult that acknowledges that positive impact on the child comes after the relationship is built call the Youth Bureau to become a big. For parents with a child between the ages of 6-14 in the City of Ithaca you can enroll at bbsithaca.org.

Ithaca Middle Schoolers can participate in the **Outing Program** which is based on the idea that everyone learns best when they can actively participate in directing their own learning process. Participants set out on an adventure and engage in activities that are challenging, rewarding, fun, and safe but with a perceived risk.

The Learning Web - Youth Exploration Program and Youth Outreach

The Learning Web **Youth Exploration Program** provides hands-on, experiential education to county youth through the mentor-apprentice model. Services include: Apprenticeships, Exploration Tours, Supported Employment, Volunteer Community Service Program, and Youth Outreach Services.

Through **Youth Outreach**, the Learning Web provides young adults age 16-24 living on their own with unstable or no housing, support in finding housing, finding jobs, completing their education, home keeping, managing finances, parenting as well as a safe place to relax for a while, use a computer, and get help from a supportive Youth Outreach staff person.

Teen Pregnancy/Parenting Program**

TP3 is a confidential and comprehensive teen pregnancy and parenting support program designed to meet individual needs, regardless of income. TP3 offers one-on-one attention with a personal case manager, pre-natal, parenting and child development information and referrals to appropriate agencies. TPD helps with applying to assistance programs; transportation to medical, mental health and social service appointments; information on birth control, sexuality and healthy decision-making; finding childcare; and general advocacy.
