Village of Lansing Planning Board Meeting August 26, 2014

The meeting of the Village of Lansing Planning Board was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Chairman

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2 Mario Tomei. 3 Present at the meeting were Planning Board Members: Maria Stycos, Phil Dankert, Deborah Dawson, Lisa Schleelein; Alternate Member, John Gillott; Code Enforcement Officer, Marty Moseley; 4 5 Village Attorney, David Dubow; Village Engineer, Brent Cross; Village Resident,; Herman Sieverding 6 from Integrated Acquisition and Development and; Rafael Larramendi, from the Shops at Ithaca Mall. 7 Absent: None 8 **Public Comment Period** 9 Tomei opened the public comment period. With no one wishing to speak, Stycos moved to close the public comment period. Seconded by Dawson; Aves by Tomei, Dankert, Stycos, Schleelein, and 10 Dawson. 11 12 **Informal Presentation on proposed project at 9 Brown Road** (Proposed 2800 square foot addition) 13 14 Sieverding noted that they are requesting proposed additions totaling 2800 square feet for the existing 9 Brown Road building which is currently being occupied by the BinOptics Company. Sieverding added 15 16 that the additions would consist of a clean room, a loading dock, and a small chemical storage area that 17 will replace the existing chemical storage facility. Sieverding noted that the additions would not increase the overall impervious area for the lot. Sieverding added that part of the existing parking lot and some of 18 19 the sidewalk will be taken to provide for the proposed additions. Sieverding noted that the front yard 20 setbacks are more than adequate for the proposed additions, the lot coverage is significantly under 25%, and the existing site will lose about 9 parking spaces in total. Sieverding indicated that they would 21 propose to re-stripe the parking spaces from 9' to 8.5' which would provide for the number of parking 22 23 spaces to stay the same. 24 Cross questioned the reduction in parking space width and noted that the drive lanes will be 25 approximately 20' due to not having larger vehicle traffic. 26 Sieverding noted that most people utilize the Thornwood vehicle entrance/exit. 27 The following comments and questions came from the Planning Board members: 28 1. The building could be divided into separate uses and then determine the parking based on each 29 percentage. 30 2. In the event the existing landscaping were to be displaced additional vegetation should be planted 31 to account for the displacement. 3. Will there be any additional exterior lighting. 32 4. What types of chemicals would be stored on site. 33

Sieverding indicated that there would be no additional exterior lighting, that they would replace the three

trees that are in need of removal for the proposed addition, and they would provide a list of chemicals to

- 36 Moseley for approval through the New York State Building Code. Sieverding noted that the building will
- 37 be slightly taller to account for HVAC roof top units for the clean room.
- 38 Cross noted that he will submit an official report for the next meeting.
- 39 The Planning Board informally reviewed the short EAF (Environmental Assessment Form) and suggested
- 40 some minor changes.

41 Approval of "Welcome Back Students" sign for the Shops at Ithaca Mall

- 42 Larramendi indicated that the 144 square foot sign will be up until the end of September.
- 43 Moseley indicated that the mall would have approximately 422 square feet left in their Planned Sign
- 44 Area.
- 45 Dawson moved to approve the 144 square foot temporary sign. Seconded by Stycos; Ayes by Tomei,
- 46 Dankert, Stycos, Schleelein, and Dawson.

47 <u>Discussion on Proposed Lighting Code</u>

- 48 Schleelein explained the situation of the proposed lighting code.
- 49 Discussion was had about the Lighting Commission and if the Commission will continue due to the
- 50 proposed code.
- Tomei indicated that he would like to continue the Lighting Commission.
- 52 Dubow noted that any new law as part of the Village Code would need to clarify the manner in which the
- lighting requirements would be established and enforced, and a determination would need to be made as
- 54 to whether or not the lighting commission would remain, and what their role would be.
- Moseley noted that the intent would be to have the Lighting Commission continue as they have been.
- 56 Dubow suggested that the proposed draft Lighting Code should be informally discussed with the Board of
- 57 Trustees to make sure that all parties agree with the direction being discussed.

58 Discussion on No Parking for Dart and Graham Roads

- Dawson noted that she was against making parking illegal on Dart Drive and Graham Road. Dawson
- 60 noted that there is not currently a problem and the Board should revisit this topic if an issue develops.
- After further discussion the Planning Board determined that they would wait and see if any parking issues
- do in fact develop and then react to the situation at that point in time.

63 **Approval of Minutes:**

65 **Trustee Report:** 66 Stycos reported on the August 18th Trustee meeting. For a report on that meeting please see the Trustee 67 68 minutes. 69 **Other Business:** 70 Tomei suggested that, with respect to Pastor Felker's email, when all Planning Board members receive emails of complaints that they wait to respond after Tomei can meet with Moseley to discuss and review 71 72 the files. In that manner, Moseley or possibly Tomei could provide a response to the correct individual. Tomei noted that the response that was provided in this case by one of the Planning Board Members was 73 74 not incorrect and was polite. 75 Lisa moved to recommend to the Board of Trustees, that they consider amending the Shops at 76 Ithaca Mall to allow for a temporary sign of up to 144 square feet to be approved administratively and to allow for a temporary sign to be erected for not more than 90 days per year. After a proposed sign 77 78 exceeds 144 square feet, the sign shall be approved by the Planning Board prior to installation. Seconded 79 by Stycos; Ayes by Tomei, Dankert, Stycos, Schleelein, and Dawson. 80 **Adjournment** Dankert moved to adjourn at 9:20 PM. Seconded by Schleelein; Ayes by Tomei, Dankert, Stycos, 81 Schleelein, and Dawson. 82
